### **Course Description:**

In the last part of the literary theory and criticism course, we will be surveying the major schools of the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Since the time period covered is far shorter compared to the earlier parts of the course, the readings are grouped more thematically than chronologically although such grouping is somewhat artificial as these schools of thought, if they may be called as such, cannot be easily thought as completely distinct from one another. The main objective is to provide you with a broad view of the contemporary debates on reading and interpreting literary texts.

### **Course Requirements:**

Not all the selections are easy readings and it is crucial that you come to class having read the assigned readings for the week. Attendance at all lectures is expected. If for some reason you must miss class, it is your responsibility to obtain information about the lecture, any alterations that may have been made to the syllabus in regard to forthcoming reading and writing assignments.

The deadlines for assignments will be announced at the beginning of the semester, allowing you ample time to complete them. Therefore, no late submissions will be accepted – unless you have a legitimate officially acceptable and/or documentable excuse to miss the deadline.
