FA 488 Survey of 19th Century Music Spring 2024

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Course Objective: Music of the 19th century composers is very popular among classical music listeners. Music of this era, labeled as *Romantic Music,* is frequently performed and recorded.

During the semester, historic development of main musical genres presented in 19th century will be explained; representative compositions will be studied in detail regarding their compositional backgrounds as well as their musical forms. Lives of composers will also be studied. Conscious listening will be an important part of this class. Performance practice traditions as well as modern performance practices will be discussed.
